Who can join

The RIBA Part 3 course is open to those candidates who normally meet th following qualifications and experience:

- Candidates who hold UK RIBA validated qualifications at part 1 and at part 2.
- Candidates who have completed the appropriate qualification/s listed under Annex V or Annex VI of the Mutual Recognition of Professional Qualifications Directive (2005/36/EC).
- Candidates who hold international qualifications equivalent to part 1 and part 2, and who have completed the ARB Prescribed Examination at part 1 and part 2.
- Candidates will be accepted on to the course with relevant overseas qualifications, but they will be required to undertake the ARB prescribed exams before registration with ARB.

Candidates should be working towards completion of a minimum of 24 months practical experience under the direct supervision of a professional working in the construction industry, which should include at least 12 months working in the EEA, Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, under the direct supervision of an architect. This should be complete by the RIBA Part 3 oral examination stage.

Candidates who do not meet the normal practical training outlined above should contact the RIBA Part 3 department to discuss their situation and options available.

The fee for the Course and Examination is as follows:

(Payable within four weeks of application)

Course Fee £2035.42+ VAT (£2442.50)

Examination Fee £475 + VAT (£570)

How to apply

Please complete the attached application form in block capitals and return it to the RIBA with the appropriate documentation. This includes a passport sized photograph/image.

Your application will be reviewed by the Professional Education Programmes Director within two weeks of being received.

New candidates will then receive a confirmation email of admission onto the course. This email will include information about the course, contact details for your Professional Studies Advisor and your registration fee invoice.

The course fee is payable from January 2024, either by invoice or direct debit. Further details can be found on the payment method page (4).

Your name will be put forward for election to Associate Membership² by the membership admissions committee within 4 weeks of your application being received.
