Who can join

Chartered Members must meet one of the following criteria:

- RIBA recognised Parts 1, 2 and 3 (or equivalent)
- A qualification in architecture which is covered by the EU Professional Qualifications Directive (2005/36/EC) with access to the profession of architect in the EU country in which the qualification was gained and a minimum of 2 years of professional practical experience

Please note you must be registered with the Architects Registration Board (ARB) in order to practise as, and use the title of 'Architect' in the UK. Please visit **www.arb.org.uk** for more information.


