BACKGROUND

Tracing its origins back to the late 19th century, the Royal Society of Architects in Wales (RSAW) was granted the Royal pre-fix in 1994 and represents and supports around 650 Chartered Members of our parent body, the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA), who live and work in Wales.

RSAW represents the voice of the architectural profession in Wales, striving to influence Welsh Government and related agencies in Wales.

With a staff team based in Cardiff, the RSAW Council and members in four branches and special interest groups, we promote the value of good design through awards schemes, exhibitions, festivals and conferences, regularly working in partnership with other professional bodies and Welsh national organisations. We connect with leading figures in the political and creative arenas through our Honorary Member programme.

WHAT DOES RSAW DO?

Engaging members in the civic and political life of Wales

We work with partners to deliver high-profile, public-facing events such as the National Eisteddfod of Wales Gold Medal exhibition of architecture with Design Commission for Wales (DCFW).

Maintenance of professional standards

The RIBA and RSAW CPD programmes and platforms allow members to keep their knowledge up to date, and in line with new Welsh legislation where appropriate. The new RIBA Academy is a great compliment to the RSAW programmes and we continue to be a partner of the Built Environment Alliance Cymru. RSAW Conference is now able to be delivered across the RIBA, Nationally and Internationally.

Promotion of Architects

With exhibitions of each year's Award-winning buildings and through the Wales Festival of Architecture we promote the achievements of architects in Wales, from small scale to major projects. We co-publish with the University of Wales Press The Architecture of Wales series, while Touchstone journal provides an annual update on new and projected developments in Wales.

Welsh Government policy and influence

We work with members and engage with ministers and civil servants to allow us to be the voice of architects in Wales and we keep members informed through regular updates.

RSAW meets with its members to consult on the Welsh Governments consultations on Part L & F of the Building Regulations, Mandatory Quality Standards for New Homes and the proposed Amendments to the Architects Act (1997).

Initiatives

Revealing Wales Series 2 is in production and will be launched in Summer 2021.

Small Practice Network formed. A forum for sole practitioners, small practices and emerging practices to share, collaborate and support.

Education

Student Mentoring programme reinstated for year 3 students studying at the Welsh School of Architecture and the University of Wales Trinity Saint David. We have 28 mentors and 44 students involved in our 2020/2021 programme.

Future Architects Network launched by the RIBA in 2020 is a network for future and emerging architects designed to support, inspire and provide a voice as students transition from study to practice. It supports students all the way through their educational journey and offers advice and information about studying architecture.

RSAW have been working closely with Schools of Architecture in Wales to develop a suite of activity for students and to promote what Future Architects can bring to them in Wales and across the UK.


Addysg

ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Like many things in 2020, the 27th RSAW Annual Conference was delivered digitally due to the coronavirus pandemic. Taking place across a week in November, 309 delegates from across Wales, the UK and Internationally, joined speakers and contributors in a series of webinars to contemplate the three R's in architecture: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle.

The speakers across the week showed delegates how the architectural profession can work together to reduce waste and design within the limits of our environment.

The week began with a focus on heritage. John Edwards (Edwards Hart Consultants) examined how best to raise standards in energy efficiency retrofit, while Edward Holland (Holland Heritage) outlined the main challenges of adaptive reuse.

The student day considered how background and culture can influence design ethos (George Aboagye Williams), informed many of the student delegates of RIBA's Future Architects programme (Kate Hunter, RIBA) and showcased the innovative Re-Fabricate initiative (Paul Daramola).

We looked at place and space in a post-pandemic context. Nicola Gillen (Cushman and Wakefield) analysed the future of office spaces and Sarah Featherstone (Featherstone Young) shared with delegates her thoughts on light-touch living and designing in 'baggy' space.

With a focus to housing, Justin Bere (bere:architects) scrutinised the role of Passivhaus, Steven Harris and Catherine Roberts (CRSH Energy and Architecture) provided an update on the performance of their net-zero home 10 years after its construction and Andy Sutton (Sero Homes) detailed Sero's continued work on optimised retrofit.

To round off the week, delegates welcomed two international speakers to give an overview of their respective works. Anders Lendager (Lendager Group) provided a whistle-stop tour of his vast experience of building with waste, while Ingrid van der Heijden (Civic Architects) gave an overview of her practice's public architecture – a series of generous buildings and places.
