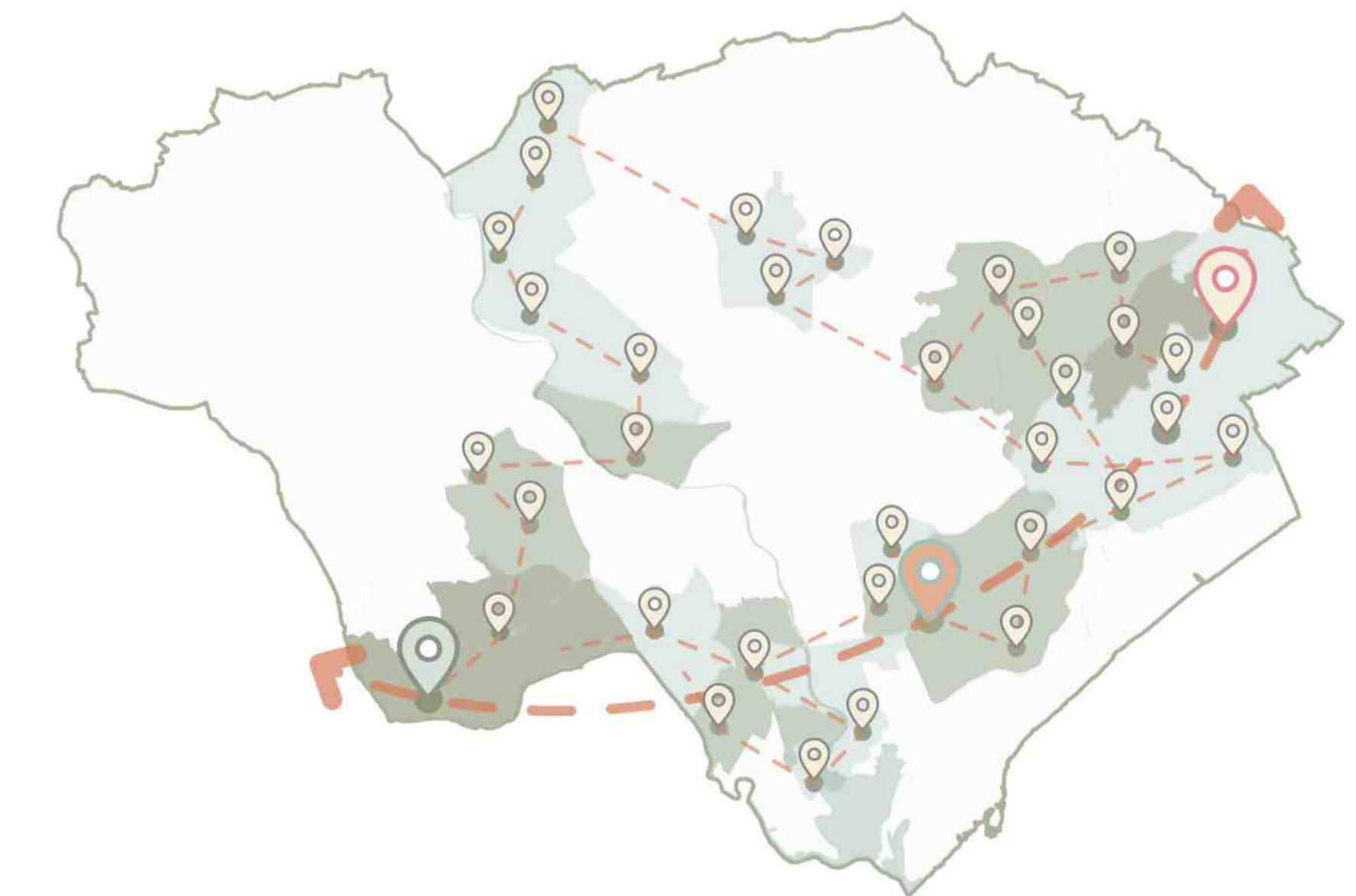
map of Cardiff
