Alan SHORT
President of Clare Hall College, Cambridge
The Professor of Architecture (1970), University of Cambridge
Former Head of the Department of Architecture (2001-04), University of Cambridge

Alan Short has been the Professor of Architecture at the University of Cambridge since 2001, Head of Dept. 2001-04. His work focuses on the design of sustainable buildings. He won the RIBA President's Award for 'Outstanding Professional Practice-located Research' 2007 for the project 'Design for the Warming Environment' and the 2009 RIBA President's Commendation for Outstanding University-located Research for his work on the resilience of the NHS Estate. He is a PR China Ministry of Education Distinguished Professor, a Guest Professor at Zhejiang University and was the 2014 George Collins Fellow of the Society of Architectural Historians and 2013-14 Geddes Fellow at the University of Edinburgh.



François PENZ

Professor of Architecture and the Moving Image, University of Cambridge Former Head of the Department of Architecture (2017-2019), University of Cambridge Emeritus Fellow of Darwin College, Cambridge

François Penz is an Emeritus Professor of the Department of Architecture and a Fellow of Darwin College, University of Cambridge. His AHRC project 'A Cinematic Musée Imaginaire of Spatial Cultural Differences' (2017-2020) expanded to China and Japan in particular, many of the ideas developed in his monograph 'Cinematic Aided Design: An Everyday Life Approach to Architecture' (Routledge 2018). He recently co-

edited 'The Everyday in Visual Culture: Slices of Lives' (Routledge 2022). As part of his practice-based research, he runs film & architecture workshops in Venice as well as at the British School at Rome.

Since 1989, Jianguo has been teaching at the Research Institute of Architecture, the Department of Architecture and the School of Architecture at Southeast University. He served as Dean of the School of Architecture from 2003 to 2014. He is now the Director of the Urban Design Research Centre of Southeast University, while holding several academic positions, including the Vice President of the Architectural Society of China, the Vice President of the Urban Planning Society of China, the Director of the Ministry of Education's Steering Committee on the Teaching of Architecture, and the Editor-in-chief of Frontiers of Architectural Research. His research is focused on architecture, urban design and architectural heritage conservation, covering both frontier and engineering practice. His published work includes Urban Design, Theory and Method of Modern Urban Design, and other titles.



Patrick USBORNE

Chair of the Cambridge Association of Architects

Co-Founder of Perpendicular Architecture, Cambridge

Patrick Usborne is Chair of the Cambridge Association of Architects and is a leading advocate for manufactured regenerative design with meaningful social value. An expert in designing buildings more intelligently, using bio-based engineered materials, Patrick co-founded Perpendicular Architecture, a design consultancy and architectural practice based at the Cambridge Institute of Sustainability Leadership. Their aim is to solve the complex challenges we're currently facing including the Climate Emergency and Social Inequality by moving the built environment towards a regenerative circular economy. Patrick previously worked on projects in China, Singapore, India, Kazakhstan & Russia, and is co-founder of The Positive Collective, a think-tank to help turn theory into reality.



MENG Jianmin
Academician (Fellow) of Chinese Academy of Engineering (CAE)
Distinguished Professor of Shenzhen University
Director of Benyuan Design and Research Center, Shenzhen University

Meng Jianmin is an Academician of the Chinese Academy of Engineering and a Chinese Architectural Design Master. Meng graduated from Southeast University with a PhD. He is a professional-level senior engineer and Class 1 registered architect. He is the Chief Architect of Shenzhen General Institute of Architectural Design Research Co. Ltd., Vice Chairman of the Architectural Society of China (ASC), Chairman of the Institute of Healthcare Facilities of the Architectural Society of China, the Chief Designer of Shenzhen Bay Super Headquarters Base, Chairman of Shenzhen Experts United Association, etc. He was given the title of Chinese Architectural Design Master, the Liang Sicheng Architecture Award, and the China Design Contribution Gold Award of Guanghua Dragon Award, as well as many others. The concepts of All-Round Humanistic Care and Three-Way Methodology that he advocates have systematically provided engineering practices with an operable method and pathway.

Founder / Design Principal of Vector Architects International Awards for Excellence of the Royal Institute of Architects, Foreign Member of French Academy of Architecture.

DONG Gong founded Vector Architects in 2008. He was elected as the Foreign Member of French Academy of Architecture in 2019. He has been successively employed as design tutor at Tsinghua University and Central Academy of Fine Arts, Distinguished Visiting Professor at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, Visiting Professor at the Polytechnic University of Turin, Italy. He and Vector Architects have been invited to various major exhibitions, including the first exhibition of Chinese architecture at MoMA, New York and the 2018 Venice Biennale, "FREESPACE". DONG Gong's practice has earned him international recognition: works which represent his practice include Seashore Library, Seashore Chapel, Yangshuo Sugarhouse, the Renovation of the Captain's House, and Changjiang Art Museum.

Ying Jin is the current Director of the Martin Centre for Architectural and Urban Studies at the University of Cambridge. His main research interests are computer models of cities, and urban history. He has extensive industry experience and directed multi-disciplinary teams in building and using computer models as experimental platforms to appraise policy scenarios that involve investment, regulation, pricing and promotional campaigns. Key projects include strategic planning of London and surrounding regions, transport and energy scenarios for the European Union, long term city region and transport plans in China and in South America, and others. At the Department of Architecture, Professor Jin leads the Cities and Transport Research Group, which is one of the world's leading centres in the creation and use of conceptual and practical models for cities and city-regions.

He has published seven books to date, including *Cambridge Architecture*, a *Concise Guide* (Cambridge University Press 1994), *Architecture and its Ethical Dilemmas* (Routledge 2005), *Philosophy of Architecture* (with Christian Illies, Liverpool University Press 2014), *Thinking Through Twentieth Century Architecture* (Routledge 2023) and others.

Ren Lizhi is Senior Member of the Architectural Society of China, and the Managing Director of the Academic Committee of Architecture and Culture, the Architectural Planning and Post-evaluation Committee, and the Academic Committee on High-rise Habitat Environment at the Architectural Society of China. Ren is the Member of the Hong Kong Institute of Architects, RIBA Chartered Architect, and the Member of the 4th APEC Architect China Supervision Committee. His projects have won numerous awards including AIA and CTBUH etc. His architectural approach focuses on the rational logic and natural laws of architecture, ways to optimise the urban spatial structure system with architectural elements, and the boundaries and diversity of different cultures in the context of globalisation.

Her most recent book Housing for Hope and Wellbeing was published this year.

His designs respect the environment and create appropriate space. They are constructed in clever and rational ways and take advantage of limited conditions creatively. These buildings form a balance between the perceptual and the rational, generating a poetic space and atmosphere. While emphasising personal ideals, his designs also consider social responsibility, and return to the essence of the building under a kind of informal but effective control.
